Who We Are

Uthando (Love) South Africa is a multi-award-winning fair-trade in tourism certified non-profit organisation, linking tourism to a supply chain of support for community development projects.

What We Do

At Uthando South Africa, we provide funding (generated through tourism) and donations (generated through engaging humanitarians and purpose-driven companies) to support 60+ community development projects in South Africa(mainly in Cape Town) impacting sectors such as: food -security, education, skills development, arts & culture, health & safety, animal welfare, and seniors.

Why We Do It

The reality is that South Africa faces high levels of poverty, which is at a level of 56.8% (Stats SA, 2025). Poverty leads to generational suffering and inaccess to the resources that will break this cycle.

At Uthando SA, we aim to ignite socio-economic change within impoverished communities, by supporting projects breaking the cycle of poverty through their capacity building programmes. Our purpose is to deepen and expand the impact of 60+ projects and counting, allowing more people to access the benefits of these programmes, and ultimately fostering socio-economic upliftment across South Africa.

Who We Are

The Heart of Cape Town (HOCT) is a "Movement For Change", started by Uthando SA in January 2024, with the aim to address and mitigate major societal challenges in South Africa, such as: violence, suffering, division, and inequality, addressed through campaign activations that are centred around raising awareness of the problems, while spreading messages of Peace, Love, Unity & Compassion, to shift the collective consciousness of people towards acknowledgement of these problems & advocate for change.

What We Do

Heart Campaign: The Heart Campaign seeks to elevate the consciousness of people within communities ladened by gangsterism and violence. The campaign utilises entertainment as a tool to engage challenged community members, and spread messages of Peace, Love, & Unity, to provide emotional support around the challenges faced by these communities, while empowering people with the tools to become advocates for change within their own communities.

Lovenaire Campaign: This campaign raises awareness around the needs of specific social development projects, engaging with humanitarians & purpose-driven companies to generate support for these projects, with the aim to deepen and expand the socio-economic impact of each project.



FOOD-SECURITY

Problem Statement

As per a Statistics South Africa Report (2023), around 25% of South Africans live on the food poverty line. This means that roughly a quarter of our citizens cannot afford to purchase their basic nutritional needs on a daily basis.

Impact

We Are Africa is supporting the Uthando (Love) Social Development Projects supply chain for Food-Security, strengthening food-security initiatives within Cape Town's most food-impoverished communities.

A significant amount has been contributed towards 4 impactful food-security projects in Cape Town, transforming food-sustainability within these high-need regions.

A group of sixteen staff and volunteers who work to provide support to urban micro-farmers on the ground through training, infrastructure support, access to market, as well as organisation building.

WHAT WE DO

Our core business is based on the following four pillars:

- providing training and extension services to small scale farmers
- providing access to affordable seeds, seedlings and manure for production
- provide support around capital infrastructure, such as irrigation and manure for soil building, depending on available funding
- provide access to market to allow farmers to sell surplus vegetables
- provide organisation building and administrative support

WHAT WE DO
















MOYA WE KHAYA (SPIRIT OF HOME) AGRIHUB

Our core food-security focus points are:



- Daily Food Scheme We feed around 250 people per day in Hanover Park



As per a Statistics South Africa Report (2023), 44.7% of youth aged 15-34, are without education, employment or training. Overall, these figures confirm the disparity within access to education around the country. Some communities are blessed with an abundance of educational facilities, while others are left under-served.




USE OF FUNDS

HOMELESSNESS

PROBLEM STATEMENT

As per a Statistics South Africa Report (2023), the number of homeless people in South Africa stood at 55,719, and to make things even more clear, 8 out of 10 of these people are roofless, while 2 are sustainably utilising shelter services. In Cape Town, the number of homeless people stands at 14 000, with 50% of these people being unable to sustainably utilise shelter services.

IMPACT

We Are Africa is supporting the Uthando (Love) Social Development Projects supply chain for Homelessness, going towards the operational expenses at shelters, allowing these facilities to provide rehabilitation programmes, shelter, food, showers, and clothing, to the homeless, without needing to charge them.

U Turn Homeless Ministries

WHAT WE DO

U-turn provides homeless people with work opportunities, on-the-job training, stipends, shelter, food, transport, life skills, therapy and relapse prevention.

Six months after graduating from the U-turn programme, we check in to find out whether our graduates remain sober, employed and housed.

As per a Statistics South Africa Report (2023), the most recent youth (15-34) unemployment rate percentage stands at 46.3%. Unemployment or the lack of skills to employ oneself are the underlying reasons for poverty, and when half the country's youth are unemployed or unskilled, poverty becomes the reality for so many people.

Impact

We Are Africa is supporting the Uthando (Love) Social Development Projects supply chain for Arts & Culture, supporting skills development programmes that are transforming the lives of our youth, through capacity building via the Arts.

WHO WE ARE

Zama Dance School Trust is an award-winning dance studio located in the heart of Gugulethu, Cape

From a small dream in 1984, the school grew until by 1989 it had become an established Trust and registered NPO. Today, Zama caters for up to 100 students annually from 6 to 17 years old. Open six days a week, students enjoy the expertise of both local and international Ballet teachers.

WHAT WE DO

Students spend a considerable amount of their time at Zama. They attend classes three times a week, or more when preparing for performances or exams.

Mindful that the school does not exist in a vacuum, learners are provided with nutritious meals through the feeding scheme and are encouraged to use the premises to do homework. In some cases, support extends to medical and dental care.

Launched in 2010, Zama's feeding scheme ensures that all students receive a nutritious meal after all their classes. Sandwiches with assorted fillings or hot meals are prepared daily on the premises by Nomtha and are accompanied with fruit and juice or milk.

Our mission is to transform the lives of primary & high school children in Gugulethu and surrounding areas, through skills development and placement into industry



WHY WE DO IT



WHY WE DO IT



Problem Statement

In an article submitted by EAPA SA (2024), depression is said to be affecting around 27% of South Africans.

Then, in terms of physical healthcare, and focusing on our eyes, corneal services in our country are hugely under-resourced, keeping many people who have preventable corneal blindness, without their vision.

The challenges of mental and physical health struggles are without our countries borders, and action needs to be taken to alleviate these challenges.

Impact

We Are Africa is supporting the Uthando (Love) Social Development Projects supply chain for health-care, making an impact by, funding the propagation of mental health support systems, and on the physical health side, purchasing scleral lenses that are helping people to regain their sight.

WHAT WE DO



Precision designed scleral lenses create a smooth optical surface, allowing us to restore the sight of people suffering from Keratoconus . Our foundation has established a strong team of skilled professionals in South Africa and New Zealand, dedicated to world class care for patients in the Western Cape.

WHY WE DO IT

Our mission is to restore sight to young children and adults living with preventable corneal blindness in the Western Cape. We raise funds to provide world class technology to manage corneal blindness.

ANIMAL WELFARE

Problem Statement

Uthando (Love) Social Development Projects believes in the ethical treatment of animals, which means ensuring that they do not suffer from abuse, neglect, or starvation, however, in areas where poverty is prevalent, animals do tend to suffer from these challenges due to man's inability to take proper care of our furry friends, for example: Medical bills can be expensive, food may be unaffordable, and in some cases, animals like horses are worked to the bone to generate income for people.

Impact

We Are Africa is supporting the Uthando (Love) Social Development Projects supply chain for animal welfare, going towards animal protection associations, and animal clinics, that are making a positive difference in the quality of life for our furry friends.

- Cart Horse Protection Association An organisation working daily to ensure the well-being of working cart horses and donkeys on the Cape Flats, in Cape Town, South Africa.
- Mdzananda Animal Clinic An animal clinic based in Khayelitsha, providing treatment to around 1500 animals every month. They also offer a shelter for homeless animals, trying you find them permanent homes with people that will take care of them.



CART HORSE PROTECTION ASSOCIATION

WHO WE ARE

The Cart Horse Protection Association is a non-profit Cape Town based animal welfare organisation, focused on protecting working cart horses and donkeys in the Cape Flats region of Cape Town, South Africa.

WHAT WE DO

We provide subsidised farriery services as well as feed sales. We have three farriers and also offer harness and cart repair services at our clinic in Epping. Each horse along with its harness and cart is also inspected whenever they come in for shoes to make sure that their condition is acceptable.


We also have trained Equine Welfare Practitioners who go out and inspect the living conditions of these horse. If the standards are not met, interventions are put in place to relocate the horse.

Our aims – to protect working cart horses and donkeys on the Cape Flats from abuse; initiate an outreach programme for working horses and donkeys in the Western Cape; establish a formal Youth Programme on the Cape Flats.

We offer consultations, hospitilisation, surgery, sterilisations, mobile clinics, an animal ambulance, homeless animal adoptions, cruelty investigation and humane education.

WHAT WE DO

We offer consultations, hospitilisation, surgery, sterilisations, mobile clinics, an animal ambulance, homeless animal adoptions, cruelty investigation and humane education.

WHY WE DO IT

In Khayelitsha, the prevalence of socio-economic struggles results in the inability of people to afford the services offered at animal clinics. Mdzananda Animal Clinic is changing the narrative around access to animal clinics for both owners of animals, and animals without homes.

This year the amount stands at R466 125, and it will be split between 16 projects spanning across 6 sectors i.e. food-security, education, shelter, arts & culture, health & safety, and animal welfare.
