The group selected included a young, ambitious and eager Franco, whose enthusiasm and passion for nature was immediately apparent. He was trained in basic mentorship skills and then enlisted as a tent leader where he took inspiration from watching the camp guides in operation. Despite this, he enrolled for a four-year university bachelor's degree in 2003, but soon realized that his true passion still lay with the outdoors, so he gave up his studies after just six months and joined the tourism industry as a trainee guide.
